What data is available?	<ul> <li>Publicly funded drugs and pharmacy services (including monitored drugs) paid for by the ODB program. The ODB program includes the Trillium Drug Program (TDP) and OHIP+</li> <li>Most publicly funded drugs paid for by other public drug programs (e.g. Special Drugs Program - SDP)</li> <li>Monitored drugs (narcotics and controlled substances), regardless of payor, when the approved identification used was a valid Ontario Health Number. This includes monitored drugs reimbursed by private insurance or cash, which is information that's not available in DPV</li> <li>DHDR also includes additional clinically relevant data elements that are not currently viewable in DPV such as:         <ul> <li>DIN/PIN</li> <li>Medical condition / reason for use (for some medications)</li> <li>Current prescription number</li> <li>Historical Drug Utilization Review (DUR) information for some medications</li> </ul> </li> <li>*Refer to Information Available to Health Care Providers through the Digital Health Drug Repository for full details</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Publicly funded drugs and pharmacy services (including monitored drugs) paid for by the ODB program.
